

Daily Report 06/06/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 111 calls for service and arrested 7 people.

Good News – On 06/05 Brad Gough, 24, of Annapolis was arrested for a domestic violence related warrant from an assault that occurred on 05/25. Gough was charged with first, third, and fourth degree burglary, first and second degree assault, reckless endangerment, false imprisonment, and five other criminal counts. He was held without bond on this warrant. Officers had been looking for Gough when an officer saw him wearing pink medical scrub pants and a multi-color scrub shirt in the 1100 block of Madison St. Gough struck the officer during the arrest and fled on foot. Officers responded to the area, located him, and arrested him. Gough was also charged with second degree assault on a law enforcement officer and resisting arrest. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$25,000 on these charges.

Burglary – 201400002748 – 1100 block of Madison St – 05/31 at 10:15pm to 06/01 at 12:30am: A TV screen was shattered after the apartment was entered through an unlocked patio door. Nothing was reported stolen from the residence.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400002786 – 400 block of Second St – 06/03 at 6pm to 06/04 at 6am: A pair of Ralph Lauren sunglasses and a pair of Tifosi sunglasses were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400002815 – Burnside St at Severn Av – 06/05 from 10am to 3pm: The rear passenger side window was shattered and a black Garmin GPS unit was stolen from the vehicle.

Assault – 201400002818 – 900 block of Bay Ridge Rd – 06/05 at 9:30pm: Three citizens reported that they confronted a man recklessly operating a dirt bike in the parking lot of the shopping center. The man on the dirt bike cursed at them and rode off. The man returned and pointed a handgun at the three citizens before riding off again. Officers located the dirt bike, but did not locate the suspect or the gun.

Burglary – 201400002826 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 06/06 at 3:15am: The residents awoke to the sounds of someone inside their home. When they went downstairs to investigate they discovered that a Curtis 32” flat screen LCD TV had been stolen. The home was entered through an unlocked rear door.
