

Daily Report 06/10/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 126 calls for service and arrested 13 people.

Good News – On 06/06 Arrington Brown, 24, of Annapolis was arrested and charged with the theft from vehicle that occurred between 05/27 and 05/28 in the 100 block of Chester Av. Guitar equipment, an Apple iPod Touch, and money were stolen from an unlocked vehicle. Brown was charged with rogue and vagabond and two counts of theft. He was released by the District Court Commissioner.

Theft from Boat – 201400002880 – 600 block of Americana Dr – 06/08 at 12pm to 06/09 at 3:30pm: Bottles of alcohol and a tool box were stolen from a boat after the hatch was forced open.

Burglary – 201400002883 – Unit block of Church Circle – 06/08 at 11:15pm to 06/09 at 3:30pm: Bottles of alcohol were stolen from an exterior storehouse to the business after forcing open the door.

Theft from Vehicle – 201400002888 – 800 block of Bay Ridge Av – 06/08 at 10pm to 06/09 at 6:30am: A small light blue change purse containing money was stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Shooting – 201400002895 – 700 block of Newtowne Dr – 06/09 at 10:39pm: The victim, a 45 year old man from Annapolis, was shot in the leg. Preliminary investigation suggests he was shot by an acquaintance. He was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center for non-life threatening injuries.
