

Daily Report 06/12/14

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 110 calls for service and arrested 10 people.

Good News – On 06/11 Mario Mireles Ruiz, 18, of Annapolis was arrested and charged with threatening three people with a handgun. This incident occurred on 06/05 in the 900 block of Bay Ridge Rd. Mireles Ruiz was quickly identified as the suspect, but could not be found directly after the incident. Three citizens reported that they confronted Mireles Ruiz, who was recklessly operating a dirt bike in the parking lot of the shopping center. Mireles Ruiz cursed at them and rode off. He returned a short time later and pointed a handgun at two of the citizens before riding off again. Mireles Ruiz was charged with having a handgun on his person, having a handgun in a vehicle, two counts of first degree assault, and two counts of second degree assault. Mireles Ruiz is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$75,000 bond.
