

# Daily Report 06/25/14

**In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 98 calls for service and arrested 11 people.**

**Attempted Theft from Vehicle** – 201400003126 – 100 block of Monticello Av – 06/23 at 9pm to 06/24 at 4am: An apparently unlocked vehicle was entered, but nothing appears to have been stolen.

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201400003127 – 200 block of Prince George St – 06/23 at 7pm to 06/24 at 5am: Money was taken from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

**Attempted Theft from Vehicles** – 201400003128 – Unit block of Spa View Circle – 06/24 at 4am: An observant citizen reported seeing a male subject looking into vehicles in the area. The subject was not located. Two unlocked vehicles in the area appeared to have been entered with nothing stolen.

**Theft of Bicycle** – 201400003033 – 200 block of Main St – 06/17 at 11pm to 06/18 at 10am: An unsecured red Specialized mountain bicycle with a basket mount, flat front tire, and a Jack Martin sticker on the frame was stolen from the rear of the building.

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201400003137 – 200 block of Woodlawn Av – 06/23 at 7pm to 06/24 at 12pm: A black iPod Classic was stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

**Attempted Burglary** – 201400003151 – Unit block of Peale Ct – 06/24 at 11:20pm: The adult female resident reported that someone rang her doorbell, but found no one at the door. She locked her front and rear doors and made sure her house was secure. About half an hour later the resident heard noises in her fenced rear yard and saw a man with a black shirt over his face attempting to open a locked rear window. She called the police and officers arrived quickly, discovering the suspect, a 14 year old boy, climbing over the rear fence. The boy was arrested and charged with attempted first degree burglary, he was released to his guardian.

## **Fraud Alert**

Annapolis residents may have received a telephone call that was a recorded advertisement for a home alarm system. This phone call may have showed a caller ID number of "410-268-9000" and displayed the name "City of Annapolis". This phone call is not from the City of Annapolis or the Annapolis Police Department. This is a type of fraud known as spoofing. If you suspect the person you are talking to of having spoofed their phone number you should immediately ask the person to allow you to call them back. Let the caller know you will call the number displayed on your caller ID. If the caller appears hesitant or tries to get you to call a different phone number they may have spoofed the phone number.

## **Watch Your Bike Program**

There were 21 bicycles stolen in Annapolis in May. The Annapolis Police Department has a Watch Your Bike program. The program records your bicycle's serial number, manufacturer,
