Community Events

January 2 – Navy Basketball Kids’ Event at 1pm

January 5 – Auxiliary Officer Open House from 6:30pm to 8pm at 199 Taylor Avenue

In the last 96 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 298 calls for service and arrested 15 people.

Burglary – 201500005863 – 1900 block of Copeland St – 12/24 from 9:30pm to 9:40pm: The home was entered through an unlocked rear door and a black Michael Kors purse was stolen.

Assault – 201500005866 – 400 block of Captains Circle – 12/25 at 6:30am: The adult male victim was in a physical altercation with an adult male room mate when the suspect cut the victim in the head and face with a knife. The victim was transported to University of Maryland Shock Trauma Center with non-life threatening injuries. The suspect fled the area before officers arrived.

Burglary – 201500005869 – 100 block of Georgetown Rd – 12/25 from 4pm to 7:30pm: The adult female resident returned home and saw an unknown adult male exiting her home. He fled the area upon seeing her, dropping a bottle of liquor he took from the home. The home was entered through an unlocked rear window, nothing was stolen from the home.

Shooting – 201500005870 – President St at Monroe St – 12/25 at 8:50pm: The adult male victim was walking in the area when he heard gun shots. He was struck in the arm and ran to a near by home for assistance. The victim was transported to University of Maryland Shock Trauma Center with non-life threatening injuries.

Burglary – 201500005872 – 200 block of Victor Pkwy – 12/25 from 2:30pm to 11:15pm: The home was entered through an unlocked window and a jewelry box was stolen.

Armed Robbery – 201500005875 – 600 block of Royal St – 12/26 at 7pm: The adult female victim was parked in the area when a man got into the front passenger seat, pointed a handgun at her, and demanded money. After the victim gave him money he exited the vehicle and walked away.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500005881 – 900 block of Madison St – 12/26 at 10pm to 12/27 at 5:30am: A set of Masamoto chef’s knives, a Magellan GPS unit, and an Apple iPod Classic were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Police Urge Citizens “If You See Something, Say Something”

What is Suspicious Activity?

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate terrorism or terrorism-related crime. This includes, but is not limited to:

- **Unusual items or situations:** A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.
- **Eliciting information:** A person questions individuals at a level beyond curiosity about a building's purpose, operations, security procedures and/or personnel, shift changes, etc.
- **Observation/surveillance:** Someone pays unusual attention to facilities or buildings beyond a casual or professional interest. This includes extended loitering without explanation (particularly in concealed locations); unusual, repeated, and/or prolonged observation of a building (e.g., with binoculars or video camera); taking notes or measurements; counting paces; sketching floor plans, etc.

Some of these activities could be innocent—it's up to law enforcement to determine whether the behavior warrants investigation. The activities above are not all-inclusive, but have been compiled based on studies of pre-operational aspects of both successful and thwarted terrorist events over several years.
