Community Events

August 22 – Coffee with a Cop from 8am to 10am at Safeway at 1781 Forest Dr

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 314 calls for service and arrested 20 people.

Thefts from Vehicles – 201500003687 – 600 block of Burnside St – 08/13 at 8pm to 08/14 at 7:30am: Money and a silver Apple iPod Nano were stolen from two unlocked vehicles.

Attempted Armed Robbery – 201500003696 – 1000 block of Primrose Rd – 08/14 at 11pm: The adult male victim was in the parking lot when two men approached him. One of the men pressed a handgun into the victim's ribs and told him to "kick it out". The victim fought the two suspects and they left the area without taking anything. The victim was uninjured.

Bomb Threats – 201500003705 and 201500003707 – 100 block of Main St and 900 block of Bay Ridge Rd – 08/15 at 10:35 and 10:55am: The SunTrust Bank at 152 Main St and the Giant at 948 Bay Ridge Rd received similar threats over the phone. In each case, an individual demanded money and threatened the use of a device in each location. Both businesses were searched by fire and police personnel and a device was not located.
