In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 61 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Good News – On 08/19 Delass Reid, 18, of Annapolis was arrested for the attempted armed robbery that occurred in the 1000 block of Madison St on 06/15. On 06/15 at 11:20pm the adult male victim reported that a man approached him near his apartment building and demanded his cell phone. The victim refused to give up his phone and the suspect punched the victim. Two more male suspects approached displaying handguns. The victim's wife exited the apartment building and all three suspects fled the area on foot towards Brashears St. Through investigation our detectives were able to identify Reid as one of the suspects. Reid was charged with 12 criminal counts relating to the attempted robbery and assault. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center pending a hearing before a judge.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500003789 – 100 block of Hillsmere Dr – 08/19 from 8pm to 11pm: The passenger window was shattered and a Garmin GPS unit was removed from inside the front windshield of the vehicle.

School Year Starts for Annapolis Schools
