August 22 – Coffee with a Cop from 8am to 10am at Safeway at 1781 Forest Dr

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 95 calls for service and arrested 8 people.

Attempted Burglary – 201500003792 – 1800 block of Forest Dr – 08/19 at 6:30pm to 08/20 at 8:50am: The front door was damaged, but no entry was made into the business.

Burglary – 201500003797 – Unit block of Chelsea Ct – 08/20 at 2:53pm: A woman cleaning the home arrived and discovered the kitchen window broken and suspected a burglar was still inside the home. She contacted the police and officers arrived quickly finding items disrupted and no one inside the home. Officers continued searching the surrounding area and discovered two 16 year old male juveniles in the woods. One male was identified and responded to the police station with a guardian to be interviewed. The other male was arrested on outstanding juvenile citations for burglary. The juvenile was charged with burglaries that occurred 06/21 in the 200 block of Janwall St, 07/09 in the unit block of Arbor Hill Rd and unit block of Janwall Ct, and 07/17 in the unit block of Sandstone Ct and 300 block of Dewey Dr. The juvenile was transported to Cheltenham Youth Facility. Two Toshiba laptop computers were stolen from the home on Chelsea Ct and they were not recovered.
