

# Daily Report 12/07/15

## Community Events

December 8 – Neighborhood Safety Council from 6:30pm to 8pm at Annapolis Police Headquarters at 199 Taylor Av

December 10 and 17 – CoCo with the PoPo from 7pm to 9pm outside 220 Main St - Enjoy a free cup of hot chocolate with your local police officers.

**In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 227 calls for service and arrested 22 people.**

**Burglary** – 201500005569 – 700 block of Warren Dr – 11/28 at 8am to 12/01 at 8am: The home was entered through an unlocked door and jewelry was stolen.

**Theft** – 201500005572 – 300 block of Fourth St and 400 block of Fifth St – 12/04 from 10am to 10:25am: An observant citizen reported a man removing brass sprinkler system caps from the outside of a building on Fourth St. Officers arrived and located David Wilkinson, 43, of Riva carrying 12 brass caps in a bag. Wilkinson admitted to taking the caps from the building on Fourth St and another building on Fifth St. Wilkinson was charged with two counts of theft and released on his own recognizance by the District Court Commissioner.

**Found Guns** – 201500005580 – 1400 block of Tyler Av – 12/04 at 6:54pm: Two officers were walking foot patrol in the area when they discovered a shotgun and rifle hidden inside a water run off pipe. Neither gun was reported stolen. The guns were placed into police property.

**Burglary** – 201500005581 – 100 block of S Cherry Grove Av – 12/04 from 8:22pm to 8:25pm: Officers arrived at the home responding to an intrusion alarm and discovered the rear door open. Officers searched the home, but found no one inside. The resident arrived and reported that a black Dell laptop computer was stolen from the home.

**Armed Robbery** – 201500005582 – 600 block of Skipjack Ct – 12/04 at 9:23pm: The adult male victim was in the area to make a delivery when two men wearing face masks, one holding a handgun, approached him. The suspect with the gun demanded money, which the victim handed over, then the two suspects fled the area on foot.

**Burglary** – 201500005583 – 2000 block of West St – 12/04 at 11:12pm: The rear door to the business was pried open, but an inner door remained secure and nothing was stolen.

### **Holiday Package Theft Prevention Tips**

- If possible, have your package delivered to a location where it can be received by a trusted person.
- Ask neighbors who are home during the day to watch for deliveries.
- Request that the shipper holds the package at their facility for pick up.
- Track deliveries online and confirm delivery has occurred.
- Insure valuable items.
- Provide delivery instructions, so packages are left out of sight from the street.
- Watch out for vehicles following delivery vans through neighborhoods. Some thieves will simply shadow deliver drivers and go from house to house stealing newly delivered packages.
- When sending packages take them to a post office or other shipping facility, rather than leaving them outside your home for pick up. Let the person you are sending the package to know to expect the package.
