

Daily Report 02/20/15

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 83 calls for service and arrested 8 people.

Good News – On 02/19 Desirae Hurley, 26, of Annapolis was arrested for assisting with the robbery at Bay Forest Center on 02/16. On 02/16 Michael Harsanyi robbed a woman in the parking lot and fled the area in a vehicle driven by Hurley. Harsanyi was arrested on 02/17. Hurley was charged with armed robbery, robbery, conspiracy to commit armed robbery and robbery, two counts of theft, two counts of conspiracy to commit theft, and possession of CDS. She was being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on a different case when she was served with this warrant. She is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$50,000 bond for these charges.

Theft – 201500000674 – 100 block of Main St – 02/19 at 10:10am: A man entered a jewelry store and stole a sapphire and diamond “Princess Diana” style white gold ring worth over \$21,000. While talking with employees the man was able to steal the ring and hide it under his coat. The man is described as a Caucasian male in his mid to late 50s, 6’01” tall. He was last seen wearing a black knit hat, dark rimmed glasses, a knee length black wool coat, a grey sweater, white or light colored collared shirt, and dark pants and shoes.
