

Daily Report 02/24/15

In the last 96 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 300 calls for service and arrested 27 people.

Good News – On 02/23, Bruce Diggs, 50, of Annapolis was arrested for stealing from vehicles. On 02/23 at 1:58am an observant citizen reported a man in the area of the 300 block of Melvin Av trying vehicle door handles. Officers located Bruce Diggs walking in the area. Mr. Diggs was carrying a backpack and he gave officers permission to search the bag. Officers found three GPS units, eye glasses, an air pump, and money in the backpack. Through investigation it was discovered that one of the GPS units, the eyeglasses, and air pump were stolen from a vehicle parked in the 300 block of Melvin Av. The money and another GPS unit were stolen from a vehicle parked in the unit block of South Monroe Rd. The owner of the third GPS unit could not be immediately identified. Diggs was arrested and charged with two counts of rogue and vagabond and five counts of theft. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

Stolen Vehicle – 201500000693 – 1100 block of West St – 11/06/14 to 02/17/15: A silver 2015 Toyota Corolla four door sedan, MD reg. 4MD0064, was stolen from the dealership. The vehicle is a rental car and the keys were stolen with the vehicle.

Armed Robbery – 201500000714 – 1000 block of Forest Dr – 02/21 at 9:25pm: An adult male suspect entered the gas station shop and displayed a knife to the cashier. The man demanded money and, after grabbing money from the register, fled the shop on foot.

Shooting – 201500000720 – Unit block of Ironstone Ct – 02/21 at 11pm to 02/22 at 5:30am: On 02/22 at 1:11pm Anne Arundel Medical Center notified Annapolis Police Department of a 24 year old man from Annapolis being treated for a gunshot wound to the head. Family members reported that the man left a home in the unit block of Ironstone Ct on 02/21 at 11pm and when he returned on 02/22 at 5:30am they noticed blood on his clothing. Later in the day the family checked on the man and found him semi-conscious with a wound to his head. They took the man to AAMC and after some time there it was discovered the man had been shot in the head. The man was transported to Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore.

Burglary – 201500000728 – Unit block of Hudson St – 02/20 at 5:30pm to 02/23 at 7:45am: The front door to the business was shattered and over \$2,700 worth of mostly Makita power tools were stolen.
