

# Daily Report 02/26/15

**In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 105 calls for service and arrested 5 people.**

**Good News** – On 02/25 Detectives from the Annapolis Police Department arrested William Teat, 26, of Annapolis for the shooting that occurred on 02/05 at 1:13am on West Washington St near West St. On 02/05, an officer was in the area when he heard gunshots. Officers searched the area for a victim or suspect. About ten minutes later Anne Arundel County Police Department notified officers that a shooting victim had arrived at Anne Arundel Medical Center. The victim, a 46 year old man from Annapolis, reported he was in the area of West Washington St near West St when he was shot in the right side. He was transported to Baltimore Shock Trauma. Through investigation Detectives identified Teat as the suspect in this shooting. Teat is accused of shooting at the vehicle the victim and three other adult males were in. Teat was charged with four counts of attempted second degree murder, four counts of first and second degree assault, four counts of reckless endangerment, handgun on person, and firearm used by a felon in a felony or violent crime. Teat is being held without bond at the Jennifer Road Detention Center.

There are no preventable Part One offenses to report this morning. Part One offenses are those incidents we report to the MD State Police and the F.B.I. These incidents include homicides, robberies, burglaries, rapes, serious assaults, and thefts.
