In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 115 calls for service and arrested 4 people.

The funeral of former Annapolis Mayor Roger "Pip" Moyer will be held at St. Mary's Catholic Church at 109 Duke of Gloucester Street. The next events are both on Monday, 01/19. The 1st Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Parade will step off at noon at Amos Garret Blvd and move down West St to Church Circle, around the Circle to Main St, and end at the City Dock. Roads will be closed along the parade route. At 6pm a march is scheduled from First Baptist Church of Annapolis on West Washington St to Lawyers' Mall at College Av and Bladen St. Roads will be closed as the marchers move through the area, the route they will take is not clear at this time.
