June 9 – Neighborhood Watch Meeting from 6:30pm to 8pm at 199 Taylor Av

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 88 calls for service and arrested 18 people.

Good News – On 06/01 Edward Brewer, 19, of Annapolis was arrested and charged with the robbery that occurred on May 17th in the 900 block of Jackson St. On 05/19 a robbery was reported that occurred on 05/17 at 9pm. The adult female victim reported that she was home in the 900 block of Jackson St when Edward Brewer came to visit. Following Brewer, several other suspects entered the home and one grabbed the victim and demanded money. The suspects took money from the victim and all, including Brewer, fled the home. Brewer was arrested and charged with robbery, burglary, and theft charges and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$60,000 bond.

Cancelled Stolen Vehicle – 201500002245 – 1700 block of West St – 05/26 at 12:01pm to 05/29 at 3:19pm: On 06/01 at 10:30am the business reported that the 2015 Acura RDX was never stolen. There was a mix up in the paperwork and a customer was using the vehicle.

Burglary – 201500002289 – 900 block of Bay Ridge Rd – 05/29 at 6pm to 06/01 at 7:30am: A side window to the business was pried open and a grey mountain bicycle, Samsung 46” plasma TV, and a Harrington Richardson shotgun were stolen.

Burglary – 201500002291 – Unit block of Parole St – 05/25 at 12:01pm to 05/29 at 12:01pm: A silver Kenneth Cole watch was stolen from a home. There were no signs of forced entry.

Lock Your Block

One of the easiest ways to become a victim is to leave your car and home unlocked. Please help Annapolis Police Department prevent thefts in your neighborhood by making sure your block is locked. Take the time to lock your vehicle and remove valuable items. When you leave your home double check the door and make sure all windows are closed and locked. If you are a victim of a crime report it to police quickly and provide officers with descriptions and/or serial numbers of the items taken.
