June 16 – Coffee with a Cop from 8am to 10am at Zu Coffee at 934 Bay Ridge Rd

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 104 calls for service and arrested 9 people.

Assault – 201500002452 – 200 block of Croll Dr – 06/09 at 10:46am: Officers responded for a report of an assault and met with an adult female victim who reported that she was just assaulted by an acquaintance, Carl Smith, 31, of Shady Side. The woman was outside with her child when Smith walked over to her, put both hands around her neck, and started strangling her. The victim pushed Smith to the ground and was able to break his grip and get away. Her neck was red and sore. Smith was located in the area and arrested. He exhibited signs of being under the influence of an illegal drug. Smith was charged with first and second degree assault and reckless endangerment and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$20,000 bond.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500002453 – 1000 Norman Dr – 06/08 at 8:30pm to 06/09 at 8:30am: A small black purse and white Samsung cell phone were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201500002454 – 100 block of Hillsmere Dr – 06/09 from 1:05am to 8:40am: The rear door was forced open and money was stolen from the business.

Theft of Package – 201500002456 – 1100 block of Hoover St – 06/09 from 12:56pm to 2pm: A package containing a Great Northern popcorn machine was stolen from outside the front door to the home after it was delivered by FedEx.

Attempted Theft from Vehicle – 201500002463 – 800 block of Janice Dr – 06/10 at 2:14am: The vehicle owner was letting his dog outside of his home when he saw someone leaning into his parked vehicle. The owner yelled at the man and the man fled the area on a bicycle. The vehicle was left unlocked and nothing was taken from the vehicle.

One of the easiest ways to become a victim is to leave your car and home unlocked. Please help Annapolis Police Department prevent thefts in your neighborhood by making sure your block is locked. Take the time to lock your vehicle and remove valuable items. When you leave your home double check the door and make sure all windows are closed and locked. Report suspicious activity to police by calling [410-268-4141](tel:410-268-4141) or, in an emergency, dial 911. If you are a

victim of a crime report it to police quickly and provide officers with descriptions and/or serial numbers of the items taken. Talk to your neighbors and encourage them to lock your block.
