

Daily Report 06/12/15

Community Events

June 16 – Coffee with a Cop from 8am to 10am at Zu Coffee at 934 Bay Ridge Rd

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 96 calls for service and arrested 9 people.

Good News – On 06/11 Detectives obtained an arrest warrant for Demonte Smith, 21, of Annapolis charging him with the shooting that occurred on 06/05 at the Bay Ridge Shell gas station at 2232 Bay Ridge Av. On 06/05 at 5:01pm officers received a call for shots fired and did not locate a victim. At 6:50pm the Calvert County Sheriff's Office contacted the Annapolis Police Department and reported a 24 year old female had been shot in Annapolis and then was driven to Calvert County. The victim is still in serious condition. Through investigation Smith was identified as the suspect and this warrant was obtained. Smith is currently incarcerated at the Jennifer Road Detention. He was arrested for other open warrants on 06/08 and is being held without bond.

Assault – 201500002467 – Forest Dr near Spa Rd – 06/10 at 2:20pm: Officers responded to the area for a report of the front seat passenger of a vehicle waving a gun out of the window. Officers located the vehicle matching the description given and stopped it at Forest Dr and South Cherry Grove Av. A realistic looking airsoft bb gun with no identifying orange tip was located inside the vehicle. Christopher Jarin, 18, of Edgewater was identified as the suspect waving the bb gun out the vehicle window. Jarin was arrested and charged with assault and reckless endangerment. Jarin was released by the District Court Commissioner on his own recognizance.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500002472 – 600 block of Greenbriar La – 06/09 at 9:30pm to 06/10 at 7:30am: Keys were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201500002476 – 600 block of Genessee St – 06/10: On 06/11 at 1:30am an officer saw a Mazda operating on West St near Admiral Dr without working tag lights. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but it continued driving slowly into the parking lot of the library at 1410 West St. After driving through the parking lot and exiting the rear entrance, the vehicle's speed increased on Poplar Av until it abruptly stopped at Woodlawn Av and the two occupants exited the vehicle and fled on foot. Officers pursued the two and lost sight of the driver, but captured the occupant, identified as Ricardo Luengas Silva, 20, of Annapolis, in front of the police station on Poplar Trail. Officers contacted the vehicle owner at her home in the 600 block of Genessee St. The woman reported that she was the victim of an unreported burglary that happened on 06/10 prior to 2pm, when an unlocked window was used to enter the home. She was unaware that her vehicle key had been stolen in the burglary. The vehicle was not taken at the time of the burglary and was last seen by the owner on 06/10 at 5pm. A Microsoft Xbox 360 game console with two controllers, a jewelry box, and a blue Samsung Galaxy S3 were also stolen from the home. Luengas Silva was charged with motor vehicle theft, burglary, theft, and rogue and vagabond. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$25,000 bond.
