Community Events

June 16 – Coffee with a Cop from 8am to 10am at Zu Coffee at 934 Bay Ridge Rd

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 291 calls for service and arrested 14 people.

Burglary – 201500002497 – 400 block of Severn Av – 06/12 from 2am to 6:30am: A dozen bottles of beer were stolen from a boat in a slip at the marina.

Burglary – 201500002515 – 1000 block of Timber Creek Dr – 06/12 at 9:55pm: Officers responded for an intrusion alarm at the home and found the front door forced open. A silver Swiss Army watch, a gold Citizen Echo watch, Hugo Boss prescription reading glasses, and an HP laptop computer were stolen from the home.

Shooting – 2015000002518 – Unit block of Bens Dr – 06/13 at 1:39am: Officers responded for a report of a man shot outside an apartment building. Upon arrival officers located the victim, William Saunders, 26, of Annapolis. He was shot once in the torso and was transported to Baltimore Shock Trauma. Attempted Burglary – 201500002542 – 1100 block of Madison St – 06/13 at 2:30pm to 06/14 at 3am: An unknown suspect attempted to enter the apartment through a window, but it does not appear anyone went inside the apartment and nothing was stolen.

Armed Robbery – 201500002544 – 200 block of Farragut Ct – 06/14 at 12:20pm: The adult male victim was walking into his apartment building when five male suspects ran up to him and entered the stairwell with him. One of the suspects displayed a handgun and another, a knife. They demanded money and the victim turned over his wallet and his red Nokia Lumina cell phone. The suspects then fled the area on foot.

Theft of Kayaks – 201500002545 – 300 block of Dewey Dr – 06/07 at 4pm to 06/14 at 1pm: A red Perception Sport kayak and a yellow Perception Patriot kayak were stolen from a community kayak rack. The lock and cable securing the kayaks was also taken.

One of the easiest ways to become a victim is to leave your car and home unlocked. Please help Annapolis Police Department prevent thefts in your neighborhood by making sure your block is

locked. Take the time to lock your vehicle and remove valuable items. When you leave your home double check the door and make sure all windows are closed and locked. Report suspicious activity to police by calling [410-268-4141](tel:410-268-4141) or, in an emergency, dial 911. If you are a victim of a crime report it to police quickly and provide officers with descriptions and/or serial numbers of the items taken.
