

Daily Report 06/25/15

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 104 calls for service and arrested 15 people.

Attempted Armed Robbery – 201500002717 – 1100 block of Madison St – 06/23 at 4:15pm: The adult male victim reported that he was inside the converted school bus, known as the goodie bus, to buy cigarettes when a man entered the bus with a hand gun in his hand. The suspect demanded property from the victim and the victim fled out the back of the bus. The victim fled to a nearby home, forced open the front door to hide inside, and called the police. The victim's vehicle, which was parked near the bus, was found with fresh damage to it, including the windshield smashed, three flat tires, and dents in the body.

Burglary – 201500002746 – 200 block of Croll Dr – 06/24 from 4:15pm to 8pm: After the home was entered through an unlocked front window a black Sony PlayStation 3 game console, a Canon PowerShot Elph digital camera, Gucci perfume, and black and grey Dell laptop computer were stolen from the home.
