

Daily Report 06/29/15

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 303 calls for service and arrested 16 people.

Good News – On 06/26 Paul Johnson, 28, of Baltimore, was arrested and charged with the attempted armed robbery that occurred on 06/23 in the 1100 block of Madison St. On 06/23 at 4:15pm the victim reported the he was inside a converted school bus to buy cigarettes when a man entered the bus with a hand gun in his hand. The suspect demanded property from the victim and the victim fled out the back of the bus. Through investigation detectives were able to identify Johnson as the suspect in this case. Johnson was charged with attempted armed robbery, attempted robbery, and 14 other criminal counts. Johnson is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$300,000 bond.

Shots Fired – 201500002767 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 06/23 at 10pm: On 06/26 the resident reported that her home was struck by a bullet on the night of the 23rd. The bullet came into the home through an upstairs bedroom wall. No one was in the room at the time.

Assault – 201500002782 – 1200 block of Graff Ct – 06/27 at 12:30am: The adult male victim reported that he was in the parking lot when a group of suspects struck him repeatedly with a metal baseball bat. The victim was treated at Anne Arundel Medical Center for lacerations and bruises.

Assault – 201500002792 – Unit block of Pleasant St – 06/27 at 7:40pm: The adult female victim was assaulted by her ex-boyfriend, Terico Childs, 22, of Annapolis. Childs punched the victim in the face and knocked her to the ground. He stomped and kicked her once she fell to the ground. Officers discovered her unconscious, lying face down in the street. She was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center and treated for her injuries. Childs was arrested and charged with first and second degree assault, reckless endangerment, and theft. Childs is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$50,000 bond.

Recovered Stolen Bicycles – 201500002793 – 200 block of Hilltop La – 06/27 at 9:25pm: An observant citizen reported that a yellow bicycle had just been stolen from a bike rack in front of the apartment building. Officers located a group of juveniles in the area, a 15 year old male from Annapolis was riding the stolen bicycle. Another juvenile in the group, a 14 year old male from Annapolis, was found to be riding a bicycle that was previously reported stolen. Both stolen bicycles were returned to their owners. The juveniles were both charged with theft and released to their guardians.

Burglary – 201500002797 – 1000 block of Tallwood Rd – 06/13 at 7:45am to 06/18 at 4pm: An apartment was possibly entered through an unlocked front door and tickets, a gift card, and a credit card were stolen.

Burglary – 201500002798 – 100 block of Main St – 06/28 at 6am: The resident discovered two men sleeping in her unlocked utility room.

Burglary – 201500002800 – 1400 block of Hunting Wood Rd – 06/12 at 7am to 06/28 at 1:45pm: The rear screen door to the home was forced open and a Sony PlayStation 4 game console, a controller, and games were stolen.

Burglary – 201500002807 – 100 block of Duke of Gloucester St – 06/28 at 8:16pm: Employees of the church reported that a suspect attempted to force open the front door to the church as they were locking the doors. Officers were able to identify the suspect as James Thomas, 45, of Annapolis. Thomas was located in the 100 block of Main St. He was arrested and charged with burglary and malicious destruction of property. Thomas is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$5,500 bond.

Thefts from Vehicles – 201500002812 – 1500 block of Ritchie La – 06/29 at 12:51am: An observant citizen reported a man entering an unlocked vehicle and trying other vehicle door handles in the area. Officers arrived and located the suspect, Deonta Stansbury, 23, of Annapolis in the 200 block of South Southwood Av. Stansbury had property stolen from vehicles in the area in his pockets. Stansbury was charged with five counts of rogue and vagabond and six counts of theft. Stansbury posted \$15,000 bond and was released.

Burglary – 201500002814 – 200 block of Garden Gate La – 06/28 at 3pm to 06/29 at 12:36am: The home was entered through an unlocked window and money was stolen.
