In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 100 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Good News – On 10/08 officers from the Annapolis Police Department arrested a man carrying a gun in the 1100 block of Medgar Evers St. At 6:45pm officers responded for a report of a man armed with a handgun. Officers arrived and located a subject matching the description given and stopped him. He was identified as Kejuan Butler, 27, of Annapolis. Officers discovered a loaded handgun in the pocket of his pants. Butler is a convicted felon, being convicted of armed robbery in 2007, and prohibited from possessing a firearm. The handgun was also listed through the National Crime Information Center as stolen from the State of New York in 1974. Butler was charged with firearm possession with a felony conviction, handgun on person, illegal possession of a regulated firearm, illegal possession of ammunition, and possession of a stolen firearm. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$50,000 bond.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500004664 – 1000 block of President St – 10/07 at 2:45pm: The adult male driver of the vehicle was in the area picking up a relative when a man he didn't know approached him and asked for a ride. The suspect reached past the driver and stole a bag of prescription medication from the center console of the vehicle. The suspect fled the area after the theft.

Attempted Theft from Vehicle – 201500004688 – 200 block of West St – 10/08 at 5:40pm: The vehicle owner saw a man enter his apparently unlocked, parked vehicle and he and a witness confronted the man. The man left the area on an orange mountain bicycle after being confronted.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle – 201500004695 – 1400 block of Forest Dr – 10/08 from 8:50pm to 9:05pm: A 1999 Mercedes was stolen after it was left running with the keys inside. The operator did not witness the theft or see any suspect. On 10/09 at 12:45am officers saw the vehicle being driven in the area of Madison St. The vehicle operator struck a fence at Madison St and Spa Creek Landing and fled on foot down Spa Creek Landing. Officers located the suspect, Lamont Crowner, 22, of Annapolis, in the stairwell of one of the buildings on Spa Creek Landing. Crowner was charged with motor vehicle theft, two counts of malicious destruction of property, and rogue and vagabond. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$5,000 bond. Crowner was released from detention at the end of August after serving time for previous motor vehicle thefts. He is currently on probation for those crimes.
