October 30 – Coffee with a Cop from 8am to 10am at the City Dock Café at 18 Market Space

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 99 calls for service and arrested 9 people.

Burglary – 201500004992 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 10/28 from 9:20am to 4:30pm: An apparently unlocked home was entered and a grey Nintendo Wii U game console and a black Sony PlayStation 3 game console were stolen.

Domestic Assault & Stolen Vehicle – 201500004999 – 100 block of Bertina Nick Way – 10/28 at 8:55pm: The 17 year old female victim reported that Scotty Moss, 23, of Annapolis punched her in the face repeatedly, threw her to the floor, and kicked her in the stomach after an argument over a cell phone. The victim was holding their three month old child during the assault. Moss fled the area, taking the victim's red 2005 Infiniti four door vehicle, MD reg. 2CA9398, without permission. Stolen Vehicle – 201500005000 – Unit block of Ridgely Av – 10/28 at 9pm: A blue 2004 Toyota 4runner, MD reg. 9BE9608, was stolen when it was left with the engine running, key in the ignition, and doors unlocked as the operator used a near by ATM. The vehicle has a white sticker in the shape of Maine and the word Maine on the rear passenger side window.
