Community Events

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 246 calls for service and arrested 34 people.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500004329 – 800 block of Bay Ridge Av – 09/17 at 7pm to 09/18 at 8am: A large blue duffel bag and DVDs were stolen from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201500004339 – Unit block of Landings Ct – 09/18 from 5:30pm to 9:45pm: The front door to the home was forced open and jewelry, a grey Dell laptop computer, and a messenger bag, made of grey canvas with a red stripe and black leather, were stolen from the home.

Attempted Theft from Vehicle – 201500004350 – 100 block of Duke of Gloucester St – 09/19 at 12:47pm: An observant citizen called the police to report a subject forcing entry into a parked vehicle. Officers arrived and found the passenger side window to the vehicle shattered. A Kate Spade purse and GPS unit were untouched within the vehicle. Nothing was stolen from the vehicle.

Attempted Burglary – 201500004356 – 1000 block of Cedar Ridge Ct – 09/17 at 12:01pm to 09/19 at 4:30pm: Unknown suspects attempted to force open the front door to the home, but they were unable to gain entry.

Stabbing – 201500004364 – 900 block of Royal St – 09/20 from 2am to 4:20am: Officers responded for a victim laying outside on the ground bleeding. They arrived and located a 46 year old male who appeared to have been stabbed several times in his back and legs. The victim reported walking home from the American Legion on Forest Dr, but was unsure how he was injured. The man was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center for treatment.

Attempted Sex Offense – 201500004370 – 700 block of Chase St – 09/20 from 5pm to 5:19pm: The adult female victim was with her child at the playground when a man approached and started talking to her. He asked for her phone number and then grabbed her arm and attempted to kiss her. When the woman told him she was calling the police he fled on foot into the woods. The man is described as a Caucasian male in his 40s, 6'03", thin build, with short white and grey hair and slight facial hair. He was last seen wearing sunglasses, a grey shirt, and blue jeans.

Crime Prevention

Prevent thefts from your vehicle. With these common sense habits and preventative measures, you can greatly reduce the chances your vehicle will become a target. Lock you doors, stow items out of sight, completely close windows and sunroofs, and park in busy well-lit areas.

Help your neighborhood prevent crime at night by leaving on outside lights that illuminate sidewalks and other walkways. Consider motion activated lights that will turn on when people need them and also alert you that someone is outside your home. Lights can aid in detecting and be a factor in preventing both property and violent crimes.
