

Daily Report 05/19/15

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 90 calls for service and arrested 3 people.

Good News – On 05/18 a vehicle stop for a cell phone violation led to an arrest for possession of illegal drugs with intent to distribute. At 6:46 p.m. an officer in the area of Chinguapin Round Rd and Lincoln Dr saw a female driver in traffic behind him holding a cell phone to her ear and talking. The officer stopped the vehicle for the violation and smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle while speaking to the driver. The passenger, Jeremy Visor, 24, of Hyattsville, admitted there was marijuana in the vehicle. Officers searched the vehicle and found a bag of marijuana weighing 31 grams in the center console of the vehicle. They continued searching and found almost \$3,000 in a backpack belonging to Visor. Also in the backpack was a bag containing 17 grams of cocaine. Another backpack in the vehicle contained 11 bags with marijuana inside. They had a total weight of 388 grams. Packaging for a scale was also found in the vehicle. Visor admitted all the drugs were his and he was arrested and charged with two counts of possession of CDS with intent to distribute, two counts of possession of CDS, and possession of CDS paraphernalia. Visor is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$15,000 bond. The driver was cited for the cell phone violation.

Theft of Bicycle – 201500001843 – 1000 block of Madison St – 05/05 from 4pm to 4:05pm: A boy left his bicycle in front of his apartment building for a few minutes and when he returned it had been stolen. The bicycle is a green Mongoose BMX style with white spoke wheels, two rear pegs, one grey and one black, and white lettering on the frame.

Vehicle Theft – 201500002038 – 1300 block of McKinley St – 05/17 at 6pm to 05/18 at 9:30am: A silver 1996 Ford Windstar minivan, MD reg. M781920, with a ladder rack on the roof was stolen from a parking spot on the street. The vehicle was left unlocked with a spare key inside.
