

Daily Report 05/20/15

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 92 calls for service and arrested 16 people.

Theft from Vehicle – 201500002049 – 300 block of Glen Av – 05/17 at 3pm to 05/19 at 7:30am: A credit card was stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201500002061 – 900 block of Primrose Rd – 05/19 at 3:26pm: An employee of the apartment complex saw two male juveniles go in and out of a vacant apartment and then enter an occupied apartment. Officers arrived and found cigar wrappers, tobacco, and a plate inside the vacant apartment. They located the two juveniles, both 17 years old and from Annapolis, inside another apartment. Also inside the apartment was a plate matching the one found in the vacant apartment and one of the juveniles had the same brand cigar in his pocket. Both juveniles were charged with 4th degree burglary on juvenile citations and released to their guardians.

Armed Robbery – 201500002067 – 1900 block of Forest Dr – 05/20 at 1am: Three male suspects, at least one of whom displayed a gun, entered a business and ordered the employees to lie on the floor. The suspects took money from the register and fled the area in a vehicle. Officers located the vehicle on West St and when the driver did not stop, pursued the vehicle into Anne Arundel County. The suspects bailed out of the vehicle and fled on foot. Officers from the Annapolis Police Department with help from Anne Arundel County Police Department searched the area and located two suspects. The suspects have been transported to the Annapolis Police Department and charges are pending.
