

Daily Report 05/22/15

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 83 calls for service and arrested 3 people.

Stolen Motorcycle – 201500002086 – 1200 block of Youngs Farm Rd – 05/20 at 3:45pm to 05/21 at 6:50am: A black 2013 Suzuki GSXR-750, MD reg. 40071Y, was stolen from the parking lot.

Burglary – 201500002089 – 100 block of West St – 05/21 at 1:43am: A Canon camera and accessories in a black Canon camera bag were stolen from an employee only area in the hotel kitchen. A suspect described as an older African American man, 50 to 65 years old, with a small grey beard, last seen wearing a baseball hat, dark t-shirt, dark jeans, and a hospital bracelet on his right wrist was seen entering the kitchen and leaving with the camera bag.

Burglary – 201500002094 – 700 block of Glenwood St – 05/20 from 8:30am to 8:30pm: Clothes and a gold and white Apple iPhone 6 Plus were stolen after a hidden key was used to enter the home.

Stolen and Recovered Vehicle – 201500002097 – 200 block of Boxwood Rd – 05/22 at 12:10am: The operator left a red 2015 Mercedes with the doors unlocked and keys inside as he was carrying items into his apartment. As he was walking back to his vehicle he heard the engine start and the vehicle drive away. Officers found the vehicle a short time later abandoned in the unit block of Silopanna Rd. The keys were not recovered.

Homicide – 201500002098 – 900 block of President St – 05/21 at 11:27pm: Officers received a call for a subject injured and possible shot in the area. They located a 39 year old man from Glen Burnie who had been shot. The man was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center, where he later died. A press release with further information will follow. Attempted Burglary – 201500002099 – 100 block of Green St – 05/22 at 12:47am: The home's alarm sounded and the resident discovered someone attempted to enter the home through an unlocked rear window.

Burglary – 201500002100 – Unit block of Charles St – 05/22 at 3:30am: One of the residents awoke to a subject in her bedroom, but thought she was dreaming. The subject left and the resident got up and found the home had been burglarized. Money, an Apple iPad Mini, and an Asus laptop tablet computer were stolen after an unlocked rear door was entered.
