June 9 – Neighborhood Watch Meeting from 6:30pm to 8pm at 199 Taylor Av

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 110 calls for service and arrested 10 people.

Good News – On 05/28 Demetrius Hawkins, 23, of Annapolis was arrested and charged with the shooting that occurred on 05/27 at 12:08am in the 1700 block of Belle Dr. Officers responded to reports of shots fired in the area. They located a 22 year old man from Annapolis suffering from two gun shot wounds to his extremities. He was transported to Baltimore Shock Trauma for treatment. Through investigation Demetrius Hawkins was identified as the suspect in the shooting. Hawkins was charged with attempted first degree murder, first and second degree assault, reckless endangerment, and the use of a firearm in a violent crime. Hawkins is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

Burglary – 201500002208 – Unit block of Janwall St – 05/27 at 3:15pm to 05/28 at 12:30am: The front door to the home was forced open and a green Dell laptop computer, a gold Seiko watch, and money were stolen.

Take the time to lock your vehicle and remove valuable items. When you leave your home double check the door and make sure all windows are closed and locked. If you are a victim of a crime report it to police quickly and provide officers with descriptions and/or serial numbers of the items taken.
