Annapolis Police Department K9's Ciro, Peko, & Atos Have Received Body Armor

Annapolis Police Department K9's Ciro, Peko, & Atos have received bullet and stab protective vests thanks to a charitable donation from non-profit organization Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. K9 Ciro, Peko, & Atos's vests were sponsored by David Marberger of Bay Ridge Wines and Spirits of Annapolis, MD and are embroidered with the sentiment "This gift of protection provided by Vested Interest in K9's, Inc".

Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. is a 501c (3) charity located in East Taunton, MA whose mission is to provide bullet and stab protective vests and other assistance to dogs of law enforcement and related agencies throughout the United States. The non-profit was established in 2009 to assist law enforcement agencies with this potentially lifesaving body armor for their four-legged K9 officers. Since its inception, Vested Interest in K9s, Inc. provided over 1,700 protective vests, in 49 states, through private and corporate donations, at a cost of over 1.6 million dollars. All vests are custom made in the USA by Armor Express in Central Lake, MI.

The program is open to dogs actively employed in the U.S. with law enforcement or related agencies who are certified and at least 20 months of age. New K9 graduates, as well as K9s with expired vests, are eligible to participate.

The donation to provide one protective vest for a law enforcement K9 is \$1,050.00. Each vest has a value between \$1,795 – \$2,234 and a five-year warranty, and an average weight of 4-5 lbs. K9 CIRO

Corporal Freeman and K9 CIRO conducted their formal Police K9 Training at the Anne Arundel County Police K9 Center, where they received more than 640 hours of training. K9 Peko



K9 PEKO is a three year old, German Shepherd/Malinois mixed breed. He is partnered with Sergeant Chris Tucker of the Annapolis Police Department and is certified in Explosive Detection and Patrol duties. K9 PEKO's initial training was completed in September of 2013 and he has worked the street since that time. While off duty K9 PEKO is obsessive about chasing his ball in the yard with the family children however, once at work he is serious in his assigned duties. He has a mischievous side and likes to get into everything, including tons of mud and dirt. Unfortunately, he isn't a fan of taking a bath, which always proves to be fun. He has provided explosive sweeps at many high profile events and has had success in locating criminal suspects wanted for crimes including armed robbery, theft, and burglary. While tracking is what he obviously enjoys the most, he really doesn't have any work tasks that he dislikes, other than being stuck in the car waiting for the next call. He would much rather be out working.

K9 Atos



K9 ATOS is a three year old, German Shepherd/Malinois mixed breed. He is partnered with Officer Josh Ingretson of the Annapolis Police Department and is certified in Drug Detection and Patrol duties. K9 ATOS's initial training was completed in September of 2013 and he has worked the street since that time. While off duty K9 ATOS loves to play ball and run the yard with the family children. While at work K9 ATOS is extremely driven. He excels at drug detection and has been very successful for the department in this venue. His high speed and intensity are effective at deterring or chasing down criminal suspects intent upon escape. Yet his social nature makes him a favorite among school children and the general public during K9 demonstrations.
