Community Events

August 13 – Coffee with a Cop 10am to noon at Bakers & Co.

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 95 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Attempted Theft from Vehicle - 201600003493 - 1900 block of Fairfax Rd - 08/08 at 11pm to 08/09 at 5am: Two unlocked vehicles were entered, but nothing was stolen from either vehicle.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle - 201600003495 - Route 665 at Chinguapin Round Rd - 08/09 at 11:15am: An Annapolis Police officer attempted to stop a motorcycle with a concealed tag traveling outbound on Route 665. The operator did not stop immediately and appeared to be attempting to flee on the motorcycle, but was not able to operate it skillfully. The operator abandoned the motorcycle in the center median and fled on foot into the wood line. A perimeter was established and K9 responded along with air support. After checking the motorcycle's concealed tag it was discovered that the motorcycle was reported stolen from Virginia on 08/01. An Anne Arundel County Sheriff's Office K9 team located the operator off of Pythian Dr. The operator was bitten by the police K9 during his apprehension. The operator was identified as Charles Wells, 20, of Annapolis. Wells was arrested and transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center for treatment of the dog bites. He was subsequently released and transported to police headquarters for booking. A backpack discarded by Wells as he fled the motorcycle was found to contain 11 grams of Marijuana and over \$2200 in currency. Wells was charged with theft, drug possession, and traffic violations.

Burglary - 201600003500 - 1000 block of Primrose Rd - 08/07 to 08/09: A television was stolen from an apartment. There were no signs of forced entry.

Burglary - 201600003506 - Unit block of Lafayette Av - 08/09 at 11:59pm: The resident was home when a man entered the home through an unlocked window. When the burglar saw the resident he fled the home without taking anything.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis

Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
