In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 107 calls for service and arrested 6 people.

Recovered Stolen Bicycle – 201600003550 – 900 block of Madison St – 08/11 at 2:50pm: A man flagged officers down telling them that he had just seen someone riding his stolen bicycle in the area. The victim had not previously reported the theft to police. Officers located and attempted to stop the man riding the bicycle. They recognized the man as Daven Lewis, 25, of Annapolis. Lewis stopped and was arrested by officers after the bicycle was identified as the stolen one. The bicycle had been taken from the 900 block of Madison St on 08/03 after it was left unlocked in the front yard of a home. Lewis was charged with theft and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$7,500 bond. Lewis was previously charged on 08/07 with fourth degree burglary, trespassing, and theft, on 07/20 with motor vehicle tampering, and on 07/15 with motor vehicle theft and theft.

Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
