

# Daily Report 08/15/16

**In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 306 calls for service and arrested 25 people.**

**Attempted Burglary** – 201600003560 – 400 block of Second St – 08/11 at 9:30pm to 08/12 at 7:15am: A window screen was removed, but the window was locked so the home was not entered. The burglars may have also attempted to enter a basement door but, that door was also locked.

**Burglary & Stolen & Recovered Vehicle** – 201600003561 – 500 block of Second St – 08/12 from 4:40am to 5:10am: The home was entered through unlocked door and a Samsung 55” flat screen television, two Apple iPads, money, a hoverboard, sunglasses and vehicle keys were stolen. The vehicle, a 2016 Ford Fusion, parked in the driveway was stolen as well. The vehicle was located parked and unoccupied on Spa Rd near Forest Dr the evening of 08/12.

**Stolen Vehicle** – 201600003566 – 100 block of Hudson St – 08/10 at 6pm to 08/12 at 10:30am: A parked silver 2011 Cadillac CTS, MD reg. 48795CG, was stolen.

**First Degree Assault** – 201600003581 – Compromise St at Newman St – 08/13 at 2:30am: Two men were playing basketball at the court when an intoxicated man kept bothering them. The man was Gerard Mackell, 53, of Annapolis. One of the men asked Mackell to leave numerous times. Mackell pulled out what the man thought was a handgun, pointed it at him, and pulled the trigger, it was a BB gun. The men took the BB gun from Mackell and called the police. Mackell was arrested and charged with first and second degree assault and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$25,000 bond.

**Theft from Delivered Package** – 201600003573 – Unit block of Washington Ct – 08/12 from 3:45pm to 7:40pm: The delivered package was forced open and the contents were stolen.

**Destruction of Property** – 201600003597 – Annapolis Police Headquarters – 08/14 at 3:30am: An officer arriving at the police department noticed that the illuminated Annapolis Police Department sign had been shattered. He also noticed a bicycle rack affixed to the rear of a patrol vehicle was damaged. He found a man wiping blood from injuries he sustained breaking the sign on the front doors of the station. The man had recently been released from the police station after being charged on a criminal citation for an unrelated incident. The man was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center for treatment. The officer applied for charges of destruction of property against the man, but he has not been arrested yet.

## **Theft from Vehicle Prevention Information**

In most cases of thefts from vehicles, thieves enter vehicles through unlocked doors, so securing your vehicle is an important way to prevent thefts. Make a habit of locking your vehicle all the time. Another important thing to do is remove valuables from your vehicle. Most of these thieves walk down the road, or through parking lots, and look to see if there is property in a vehicle and if the doors are unlocked. If your vehicle is empty and the doors are locked, thieves

may move on to the next vehicle. Thieves look for phones, tablets/laptops, GPS units, purses, wallets, or other items such as prescription medication, so secure your valuables. Also, please call us if you see suspicious activity in your neighborhood. If you see someone walking through your neighborhood in the middle of the night, they might be up to no good, and we need to come and check it out. Don't wait until the morning to call us because if you do, they will be long gone. Please talk to your neighbors about this topic so they can join us in preventing these crimes. ### **Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland**

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
