February 27 – Annapolis Police Kids Club Open House at 2pm at 199 Taylor Avenue

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 106 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Good News – On 02/25 Norwood Nutter, 34, of Arnold turned himself in on his attempted murder charges. This warrant stems from a stabbing that occurred in the unit block of Bens Dr. On 02/04 at 3:35pm officers responded to the area for a report of people arguing in the parking lot. Officers arrived, but did not locate anyone arguing or fighting. At 4pm an officer at Anne Arundel Medical Center reported that a 30 year old male victim from Annapolis arrived at the hospital with an apparent knife wound to the chest. The victim reported that he was in the parking lot at Bens Dr talking to Nutter, who is a relative of the victim. The talking escalated into a verbal argument and Nutter produced a knife and stabbed the victim in the chest. Nutter was arrested and charged with attempted first and second degree murder, first and second degree assault, reckless endangerment, and possession of dangerous weapon with intent to injure. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

There are no preventable Part One offenses to report this morning. Part One offenses are those incidents we report to the MD State Police and the F.B.I. These incidents include homicides, robberies, burglaries, rapes, serious assaults, and thefts.

Overpayment Scams

Did someone send you a check for too much money? Don't fall for the overpayment scam. How does it work? Someone responds to your posting or ad, and offers to use a cashier's check, personal check or corporate check to pay for the item you're selling. The so-called buyer (or the buyer's "agent") comes up with a reason to write the check for more than the purchase price, and asks you to wire or get prepaid cards for the difference. The checks are counterfeit, but very often, good enough to fool bank tellers. Acting in good faith, you deposit the check and wire the funds back to the "buyers." Oops: the check bounces.
