In the last 96 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 367 calls for service and arrested 17 people.

Burglary – 201600003888 – 300 block of Severn Av - 09/01 at 9:54pm: The resident reported that the motion activated camera inside her home captured a neighbor unlawfully inside. The neighbor was identified as Robert Hannon, 70, of Annapolis. A warrant was obtained for Hannon and he was arrested and charged with first, third, and fourth degree burglary and theft. Hannon was released after posting a \$100,000 bond.

Burglary – 201600003891 – 200 block of Garden Gate La – 09/02 from 7am to 9:15am: Officers responded for an intrusion alarm at the home and found a rear window forced open. The home had been entered but nothing was reported stolen. No suspects were located.

Homicide – 201600003919 – 800 block of Brooke Ct – 09/03 at 4:30pm: Officers responded for several reports of shots fired and located a vehicle with an injured male victim inside. Davon Jones, 25, of Dunkirk had been shot and was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center where he died from his injuries. Robbery – 201600003921 – 1100 block of Madison St – 09/03 at 5:15pm: The adult male victim reported that he was outside in the neighborhood when a man approached him and asked to borrow money. When the victim refused the suspect struck the victim several times, knocking him to the ground. The suspect took the victim's pants which contained his wallet and keys and fled the area. The victim waited an hour and a half to report the robbery.

Burglary – 201600003934 – 1400 block of Hunting Wood Rd – 09/01 at 1pm to 09/04 at 5:45pm: The home was entered, possibly through an unlocked window, but nothing was reported stolen.

Burglary – 201600003946 – Unit block of Basswood Rd – 09/04 from 11am to 9pm: The home was entered and jewelry and money were stolen.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
