In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 324 calls for service and arrested 15 people.

Armed Robbery – 201600004018 – Unit block of Chester Av – 09/10 at 10:26am: The adult female resident reported that a man entered the home and pointed an object she believes was a handgun at her. The suspect demanded money and took money, an iPad, and jewelry. He bound the victim's hands together and left the home. The suspect is described as an African American male with a dark complexion in his 30s, tall with a thin build, sparse beard, last seen wearing a baseball hat, white t-shirt, tight fitting black pants or jeans, and black tennis shoes with a wave pattern. Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any

identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
