

Daily Report 07/05/16

Community Events

August 2 – National Night Out 5:30pm to 8pm at the Rosalie Mitchell Community Center

In the last 96 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 466 calls for service and arrested 22 people.

Good News – On 07/02 our officers gave free breath tests to 140 pedestrians downtown as part of Mayor Pantelides' Know Your Limit campaign. Volunteer participants were asked if they felt safe to drive a car, then blew into a portable breathalyzer. Officers told them what their BAC was and gave them an educational card with information on alcohol consumption and options to get home safely. We also had extra officers working impaired driving enforcement all weekend.

On 07/05 officers recovered a loaded handgun from the 800 block of Brooke Ct. At 3am officers responded to the 700 block of Newtowne Dr for a report of a man with a handgun in the area. When they arrived two subjects fled on foot toward Brooke Ct. While running one of the subjects, Akeem Dorsey, 20, of Annapolis, dropped a loaded handgun. Both subjects were arrested. The other subject was identified as a 17 year male from Annapolis. He was charged with trespassing on a juvenile citation and released to his guardian. Dorsey is currently awaiting his initial appearance before the District Court Commissioner. He will be charged with four criminal counts relating to the illegal possession of a handgun.

Stabbing – 201600002832 – Unit block of West Washington St – 07/01 at 7:45am: The adult male victim was stabbed in the upper arm by a suspect known to him during an argument. The suspect has not been arrested yet.

Burglary – 201600002866 – Unit block of Parole St – 07/03 at 9:10am: Two adult male residents were home when a 24 year old man from Washington entered the home through a window left partially open. When the residents first encountered the man they thought he was visiting a roommate. The man appeared to be under the influence of an illegal drug and was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center for treatment. Officers investigated and determined that the man did not know anyone living at the home and had entered through a window. Charges have been applied for against the man.

Burglary – 201600002872 – 800 block of Tyler Av – 07/03 at 10:15pm: Officers responded to the home for an intrusion alarm and found a door to the home forced open. Officers searched the home, but no one was inside. Jewelry was stolen from the home.

Theft from Vehicle – 201600002878 – 1100 block of Boucher Av – 07/03 at 11am to 07/04 at 10:30am: A blue and grey backpack containing a black HP laptop computer was stolen from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201600002879 – Unit block of Morris St – 07/04 at 4am: An unlocked ground floor window was entered and money stolen from a wallet.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
