Community Events

August 2 – National Night Out 5:30pm to 8pm at the Rosalie Mitchell Community Center

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 332 calls for service and arrested 18 people.

Good News – On 07/08 officers from the Annapolis Police Department arrested two men, recovering illegal drugs and one handgun. Officers attempted to stop a vehicle on Forest Drive at Gemini Drive. Two subjects bailed out of the vehicle and fled on foot. The driver, Kamari Gross, 21, was arrested and charged with 5 criminal counts and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center. Paul M. Johnson, 3rd, 21, tossed a handgun while running. Officers recovered the loaded handgun. Johnson was charged with 12 criminal counts and is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center.

Burglary – 201600002950 – 100 Block of Conley Dr - 07/07 at 10 pm to 07/08 at 10 am: The adult female victim reported a theft of her wedding ring. The ring was removed from the kitchen window ledge.

Theft from Vehicle - 201600002969 – Unit Block of Locust Ave - 07/08 at 5 pm to 07/09 at 8:30 am: An unlocked vehicle was entered overnight and a wallet was stolen.

Theft from Vehicle - 201600002972 – Unit Block of Locust Ave - 07/08 at 8:20 pm to 07/09 at 12:00 pm: An unlocked vehicle was entered overnight a wallet was stolen from the center console and credit cards were used.

Armed Robbery - 201600002987- 700 Block of Glenwood St – 07/09 at 6:30 pm: The adult male victim reported that a female subject known to him and a male subject unknown to him agreed to give him a ride to visit family. The two subjects drove the victim to the bank where they demanded his bank card at knife point. The victim complied and the two subjects withdrew money from his account. The subjects drove the victim home and fled on foot. An arrest warrant has been issued for the known subject.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
