June 11 – Annapolis Police Kids Club – Trip to Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 115 calls for service and arrested 7 people.

Attempted Burglary – 201600002242 – 100 block of Bertina Nick Way – 05/31 from 2am to 3:30am: The adult female resident reported that she heard a loud noise overnight, but did not know what caused it. When she checked the front door in the morning she found the door and frame were damaged, but still secure.

Theft from Vehicle – 201600002247 – 1900 block of Moreland Pkwy – 05/30 at 10am to 05/31 at 10am: A catalytic converter was cut off and stolen from the undercarriage of a Ford F350 pick up truck parked in the area.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
