## Community Events

June 11 – Annapolis Police Kids Club – Trip to Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum

**In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 105 calls for service and arrested 7 people.**

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201600002371 – 800 block of Bay Ridge Av – 06/03 at 5:30pm to 06/06 at 7am: A pair of Converse sneakers and a skateboard were stolen from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

**Theft of Bicycle** – 201600002374 – 900 block of Bay Ridge Rd – 06/06 from 9:30am to 10am: A red Roadmaster women's mountain bicycle was stolen when it was left unsecured outside at the shopping center.

**Homicide** – 201600002376 – 1300 block of Tyler Av – 06/06 at 12:01pm: Officers responded to a home for a report of shooting. Once inside the home they located the 17 year old victim Kymici Brown. Brown was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center where she later died from her injuries. Ryan Surgeon, 19, of Laurel was inside the home when officers arrived and he was subsequently arrested and charged with first and second degree murder and other lesser charges. Surgeon and Brown knew each other prior to this incident. Surgeon is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$1,500,000 bond.

## **P. E. D. A. L. to Stop Annapolis Bike Thefts**

P.E.D.A.L. is an acronym for Photograph, Engrave, Document, And Lock. The Annapolis Police Department is asking citizens to P.E.D.A.L. to stop bicycle theft. Photograph your bicycle, use your cell phone and include photos of any writing on your bicycle, anything distinctive, and the serial number. Engrave personal information like your name or phone number on the frame of the bicycle. Document all the details of your bicycle, make, model, serial number, color. You can do this with the online Watch Your Bike Program at [www.annapolis.gov/police](http://www.annapolis.gov/police). And Lock your bike to a fixed object when you are out and about. When you're at home make sure you place your bike out of public view or put it in a locked garage or shed, or use a lock to secure it. Even leaving your bicycle unattended and unlocked for a few minutes can leave it open to thieves.

## **Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland**

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip

leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
