June 11 – Annapolis Police Kids Club – Trip to Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 142 calls for service and arrested 18 people.

Good News – On 06/09 Officers recovered a stolen handgun and drugs after a foot chase in the Newtowne 20 community. On 06/09 at 11:15am an officer observed a man, later identified as Damar Simms, 20, of Annapolis, standing at Brooke Ct and Betsy Ct. Simms appeared to be making hand to hand drug sales and to be carrying a handgun. When officers approached Simms he fled on foot into the woods. During the foot chase Simms threw a jacket, drugs, and a handgun. Officers caught up to Simms and arrested him. The handgun was recovered and found to be stolen from Anne Arundel County. Also, located were 20 small bags of suspected marijuana weighing approximately 17 grams, and, inside the jacket, a bag containing 14 grams of suspected heroin. Simms was charged with 11 criminal counts related to possession of illegal drugs and possession of the handgun. He is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center on \$25,000 bond.

The caller identifies themselves as calling from Microsoft and indicates that there is a problem with the person's computer. Microsoft says that they don't make unsolicited phone calls to charge you for computer security or software fixes. Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip

leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers. You can submit a tip by calling 1-866-7LOCKUP (1-866-756-2587), texting CRIMES (274637) or visiting www.metrocrimestoppers.org.
