Community Events

June 14 – Neighborhood Safety Meeting at 6:30pm at 199 Taylor Av

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 384 calls for service and arrested 19 people.

Stolen & Recovered Vehicle – 201600002449 – 500 block of Royal St – 06/09 at 8am to 06/10 at 2:30am: A 2005 Cadillac was stolen from in front of a home. DC Metro Police Department discovered the vehicle unoccupied and on fire before the owner knew the vehicle was stolen.

Burglary – 201600002473 – Unit block of Franklin St – 06/10 at 2am to 06/11 at 12pm: A belt, chandelier, and Vitamix blender were stolen from a home under construction. There were no signs of forced entry.

Shots Fired – 201600002485 – 1000 block of President St – 06/11 at 11:55pm: Officers were in the area when they heard gun shots. Three vehicles in the parking lot adjacent to the Harbour House Recreation Center were struck by gun fire.

Thefts from Vehicles – 201600002489 and 2491 – 100 block of Quiet Waters Place – 06/11 at 9:30pm to 06/12 at 8:45am: A Garmin Nuvi 55 GPS unit, a Tom Tom GPS unit, and a vehicle key were stolen from two unlocked vehicles in the area.

The caller identifies themselves as calling from Microsoft and indicates that there is a problem with the person's computer. Microsoft says that they don't make unsolicited phone calls to charge you for computer security or software fixes. Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police

Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
