## Community Events

June 14 – Neighborhood Safety Meeting at 6:30pm at 199 Taylor Av

**In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 135 calls for service and arrested 5 people.**

**Attempted Burglary** - 201600002495 - 200 block of Admiral Dr - 06/12 at 11pm to 06/13 at 7am: The screens were removed from the ground floor windows, but the windows were locked and no entry into the home was made.

**Theft from Vehicle** - 201600002503 - Unit block of Copley Ct - 06/13 from 6:20am to 12pm: A purse was stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

**Suspicious Activity** - 201600002511 - Youngs Farm Rd at Copley Ct - 06/13 at 1:30pm: A ten year old boy reported that while he was walking a dog in the area a man approached him, asked him to come over to him, and offered him candy. The boy ran home and told his parents what happened. The boy was unable to provide a description of the man.

**Burglary** - 201600002513 - 1300 block of Lloyd Ct - 06/06 at 5:30am to 06/13 at 8:20pm: Jewelry was stolen from a home. There were no signs of forced entry.

**Shots Fired** - 201600002517 - 700 block of Newtowne Dr - 06/13 at 11:55pm: Officers responded to the area for reports of gun shots. No victims were located and no property was damaged, but officers discovered a shell casing in the area.

**Armed Robbery** - 201600002518 - 1300 block of Tyler Av - 06/14 at 2am: The adult male victim was in the area to visit a relative when two men approached him on foot. The men had their faces covered and one of the men displayed a handgun. They demanded property from the victim, took the victim's money and cellphone, and then fled the area on foot.

## Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that

only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
