Community Events

June 25 – Coffee with a Cop from 10am to 12pm at The Annapolis Bookstore at 35 Maryland Av

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 120 calls for service and arrested 4 people.

Recovered Stolen Vehicle – 201600002318 – 1200 block of Ashton Ct – 05/26 from 5am to 4:30pm: The 2004 Dodge Caravan stolen from the 1200 block of Ashton Ct was recovered by officers on 06/20 in the 1300 block of Tyler Av. The vehicle was parked and unoccupied when officers found it.

Burglary – 201600002642 – Unit block of West St – 06/18 at 1pm to 06/20 at 8:30am: A mail cart and several postal bins containing mail were stolen from the U.S. Post Office. These items were found in the park on Calvert St near Clay St. There were no signs of forced entry to the building.

Serious Pedestrian Accident – 201600002655 – Forest Dr at Hilltop La – 06/21 at 12:30am: Two pedestrians were struck by a vehicle traveling on Forest Dr near Hilltop La. One pedestrian, a 26 year old female from Annapolis, was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center with serious injuries. The other pedestrian, a 32 year old man from Annapolis, was transported to the University of Baltimore Shock Trauma Center by helicopter with life threatening injuries. The driver of the vehicle, James Bruce, 74, of Annapolis, remained on scene and was cited for driving under the influence of alcohol and driving while impaired. The accident investigation is continuing.

Armed Robbery – 201600002656 – Unit block of Clay St – 06/21 at 3:15am: The adult female victim reported that she and her 13 year old granddaughter were waiting inside a vehicle to pick someone up when an adult male approached them. He pointed a handgun at the adult female victim and demanded property. The man took money from the victim and fled on foot.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
