Community Events

August 2 – National Night Out 5:30pm to 8pm at the Rosalie Mitchell Community Center

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 394 calls for service and arrested 16 people.

Rogue and Vagabond – 201600002721 – Unit block of Rockwell Ct – 06/24 at 9am: An observant caller reported a juvenile trying vehicle door handles and entering unlocked vehicles. Officers responded and located a 16 year old male from Annapolis who was identified as the suspect. The juvenile was arrested, issued a juvenile citation for five counts of rogue and vagabond and possession of burglary tools, and released to his guardian.

Theft from Vehicle – 201600002730 – 100 block of Duke of Gloucester St – 12/05 from 1pm to 2:30pm: A Yamaha tuba and a Jupiter tuba worth together approximately \$8,500 were stolen from an apparently unlocked vehicle.

Burglary – 201600002734 – 900 block of Berwick Dr – 06/24 from 6:15am to 10:15pm: The front door to the home was forced open and money and jewelry were stolen.

Theft of Bicycle – 201600002748 – Unit block of Boxwood Rd – 06/25 from 1:15pm to 1:25pm: A black and orange Mongoose Rebel Freestyle boy's bicycle was stolen from the front yard of the home.

Recovered Stolen Motor Bike – 201600002751 – 100 block of Garden Gate La – 06/25 at 7:15pm: Officers were in the area when they saw an unregistered motor bike being driven on the roadway. Officers followed the motor bike to a garage and made contact with the 15 year old male operating the motor bike. Several other motor bikes were found inside the garage including one that was stolen from Talbot County. The 15 year old was issued a juvenile citation for several motor vehicle violations and a 17 year old male was issued a juvenile citation for theft of the motor bike. Both juveniles are from Annapolis and were released to their guardians.

Shots Fired – 201600002754 – 1400 block of Tyler Av – 06/25 at 10:40pm: Officers responded for reports of shots fired and discovered an unoccupied vehicle had been struck by a bullet. No victims or suspects were located.

Burglary – 201600002759 – 600 block of Genessee St – 06/26 from 5:14am to 5:15am: The adult female resident was home when she heard her door chime, after hearing the chime a second time she went to investigate and discovered that her pink Dooney and Burke wallet had been stolen from her purse. A door to the home was left unlocked overnight.

Theft of Bicycles – 201600002762 – 600 block of Americana Dr – 06/25 at 11pm to 06/26 at 11am: A brown 1978 Murray three speed bicycle and a dark red Schwinn bicycle were stolen from the rear patio of the apartment. The bicycles were locked together with a bike chain.

Burglary – 201600002767 – Unit block of Rockwell Ct – 06/16 at 4:30pm to 06/26 at 3:25pm: The home was entered and items moved, but it is unknown if anything was stolen. There were no signs of forced entry.

Homicide – 201600002768 – 1400 block of Tyler Av – 06/26 at 4:13pm: Officers responded to the area for a report of a shooting. Upon arrival they discovered Shawn Crowdy, 23, of Annapolis shot inside a vehicle. Crowdy was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center where he died from his injuries.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
