March 19 – Annapolis Police Kids Club - Safety First at APD at 12pm at 199 Taylor Av

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 91 calls for service and arrested 8 people.

Good News – On 03/07 Eric Offutt, 17, of Annapolis, wanted for attempted murder, turned himself in to the Annapolis Police Department. Offutt was charged as an adult for the shooting that occurred in the 1100 block of Madison St on 02/24. The 32 year old victim was shot in the leg during a failed robbery attempt. The victim suffered non-life threatening injuries. Offutt was charged with attempted first and second degree murder, armed robbery, robbery, first and second degree assault, use of a firearm in a felony or violent crime, handgun on person, and possession of a handgun by a minor. Offutt is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

Burglary – 201600000885 – 900 block of Breakwater Dr – 03/04 at 5:30pm to 03/06 at 4pm: An Omega wristwatch, money, and two handguns were stolen from a home. There were no signs of forced entry.
