Community Events

March 19 – Annapolis Police Kids Club - Safety First at APD at 12pm at 199 Taylor Av

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 111 calls for service and arrested 7 people.

Stolen & Recovered Vehicle – 201600001044 – 100 block of Silopanna Rd – 03/15 at 11:50pm to 03/16 at 5:15am: On 03/16 at 5:15am officers responded to the area of Boxwood Rd and Silopanna Rd for a report of suspicious activity. A resident in the area reported two vehicles, not usual to the neighborhood, pulled into the area and parked. One of the vehicles was a Dodge pick up truck. When officers arrived both vehicles were unoccupied. Officers made contact with the owner of the pick up truck who reported that he parked the vehicle in the 1100 block of Tyler Av on 03/15 at 11:50pm and no one had permission to remove it. The owner believes he mistakenly left the vehicle unlocked with the keys inside. The other vehicle that parked in the area was determined not to be stolen.

Theft of Bicycle – 201600001079 – 1000 block of Madison St – 03/16 at 10:15pm: A pink girl's bicycle with purple and white streamers on the handlebars was stolen from the front of the apartment building. The owner reported that a juvenile boy was seen running up to the building and stealing the bike.

St. Patrick's Day

Widely celebrated across the country, St. Patrick's Day is one of the deadliest holidays due to the number of drunk drivers on the road. The St. Patrick's Day holiday period (6 p.m. March 16 to 5:59 a.m. March 18) from 2010 to 2014 saw the loss of 266 lives due to drunk-driving crashes. Officers will be on patrol throughout the region, so make sure you obey the law: Don't drink and drive, and don't let your friends do it, either. Before celebrating, decide whether you'll drink or you'll drive. If you choose to drink, designate a sober, reliable driver to get you home safely from the party. If you're planning on driving, commit to not drinking. The last thing you want is to ride home with a cop.
