## Community Events

April 12 – Neighborhood Safety Meeting at 6:30pm at 199 Taylor Av

**In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 96 calls for service and arrested 7 people.**

**Good News** – On 03/29 Kelvin Bias, 30, of Annapolis turned himself into the Annapolis Police Department for the shooting that occurred in the 800 block of Brooke Ct on 03/28 at 5:15pm. A 23 year old male victim was shot in the legs and suffered non-life threatening injuries. Bias was charged with attempted first and second degree murder, first degree assault, use of a firearm in a violent crime, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, and discharging a firearm. Bias is being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center without bond.

**Attempted Burglary** – 201600001245 – 1400 block of Tyler Av – 03/29 at 2:40am: The adult female residents were home when Orbray Sellers, 35, of Linthicum Heights forced open a window and attempted enter. Sellers fled, but officers located him in the area. Sellers was arrested and charged with attempted fourth degree burglary and destruction of property. One of the residents reported that she knew the suspect prior to this incident.
