Community Events

June 11 – Annapolis Police Kids Club – Trip to Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 80 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Good News – On 05/03 officers recovered over 30 grams of suspected heroin and \$2,000 during an arrest in the 700 block of Newtowne Dr. On 05/03 at 10:30am officers saw Akeem Young, 28, of Annapolis in the 700 block of Newtowne Dr. Young was walking back and forth to a vehicle parked with the engine running. Officers knew that Young had an open warrant for trespassing. Officers approached Young and arrested him as he was seated inside the vehicle. Officers smelled the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle and when it was searched they found 57 individual baggies of suspected heroin with a total weight of 32.9 grams. The contents of one of the bags field tested positive for heroin. A small suspected marijuana cigarette was also located inside the vehicle. Young was searched and \$2,227 and three cell phones were found in his pockets. A small amount of suspected marijuana was also recovered from Young. Young was charged with possession of narcotics with intent to distribute and possession of CDS not marijuana. Young was released from the Jennifer Road Detention Center after posting \$75,000 bond.

Attempted Theft from Vehicle – 201600001884 – 100 block of West St – 04/26 at 5:15am: An employee of the business saw a man trying to open vehicle doors in the parking garage. When the employee approached the man he ran away.

Shots Fired – 201600001907 – 700 block of Newtowne Dr – 05/11 at 8:45pm: Officers responded to the area for reports of shots fired and an armed person in the area. When officers arrived they discovered that private security officers for the community detained Richard Vermillion, 28, of Laurel. Vermillion had a black toy handgun in his waistband. Vermillion told officers he had come into the community to purchase heroin. Vermillion attempted to buy heroin from a man in the area, but when Vermillion thought he was being sold fake drugs, he displayed the toy gun in his waistband. The man ran off and Vermillion started to leave the area. As he was walking he heard gun shots, but did not believe they were aimed at him. Vermillion had two open warrants for his arrest. He was arrested and then taken to the Jennifer Road Detention Center. It was later discovered that a bullet entered an apartment in the 700 block of Newtowne Dr. It traveled through the kitchen window and struck a toaster. No one was injured.
