Community Events

June 11 – Annapolis Police Kids Club – Trip to Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum

In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 140 calls for service and arrested 5 people.

Good News – On 05/18 officers arrested a man with 37 individual baggies of suspected heroin, weighing approximately 26 grams. Officers received information from the Drug Enforcement Unit that the passenger in a cab was in possession of illegal drugs. Officers stopped the cab on Forest Hills Av and identified the passenger as Corben Johnson, 25, of Annapolis. Johnson was holding a Funyuns bag and inside that bag officers found the 37 individual baggies of suspected heroin. The small quantity of the suspected heroin field tested positive for heroin. Johnson also had \$290 in cash in his pants pockets. Johnson was arrested and charged with possession of narcotic with intent to distribute and possession of CDS. He was released from the Jennifer Road Detention Center after posting \$75,000 bond.

Burglary – 201600002023 – 200 block of Victor Pkwy – 05/14 at 9am to 05/18 at 2:30pm: Over \$16,000 in cash was stolen from the home. There were no signs of forced entry.

Theft from Vehicle – 201600002039 – 500 block of Fifth St – 05/18 at 4pm to 05/19 at 8am: A vehicle key fob and credit cards were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Theft – 201600002042 – Unit block of Church Circle – 05/19 from 12:45pm to 1pm: An adult male entered two banks on Church Circle in quick succession and stole money from each. Officers responded to a bank for a report of a theft and learned that a man asked a bank teller to trade \$600 in \$100 bills for \$600 in \$20 bills. After the money was exchanged the man asked for the \$100 bills back, but only gave the teller \$380 in the \$20 bills back. He quickly left the area, before the teller could count the money. After counting it and realizing the theft the bank called the police. The officer discovered that the same man visited another bank on Church Circle before this theft occurred. When officers spoke to that bank they reported the man also stole money from them using the same method. The man is described as a Hispanic male with light complexion, approximately 6'01", 200lbs, with short brown hair, no facial hair and last seen wearing a blue suit jacket with blue dress shirt and black tie. He had a small pin affixed to the right lapel of the jacket and several gold rings on his fingers.
