October 11 – Neighborhood Safety Meeting at 6:30pm at 199 Taylor Av

In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 266 calls for service and arrested 14 people.

Burglary – 201600004321 – 1400 block of Tyler Av – 09/30 from 9:30am to 11am: A window to the home was forced open and food was stolen.

Theft from Vehicle – 201600004328 – 1300 block of Forest Dr – 09/30 from 8am to 8:30am: A GPS unit, wallet, and phone were stolen from an unlocked vehicle.

Stolen & Recovered Vehicle – 201600004335 – 100 block of Prince George St – 09/30 at 8:30pm to 10/01 at 8:15am: A 2015 Buick was stolen after it was left apparently unlocked with keys inside. The vehicle was recovered on 10/01 at 11:20am parked and unoccupied in Bowie.

Burglary – 201600004339 – 100 block of Smith Av – 09/27 at 7pm to 09/30 at 10am: After the home was entered through an unlocked window a purse, money, and an Apple iPad were stolen.

Burglary – 201600004349 – 200 block of South Cherry Grove Av – 10/01 at 11:30am to 10/02 at 1am: A rear door to the home was forced open and a Nexus 7 series tablet computer, an Apple Macbook laptop computer, and a Sony Vaio laptop computer were stolen.

Armed Robbery – 201600004355 – Cove Rd near Primrose Rd – 10/02 at 5pm: The three adult male victims were sitting on a wooded pathway in the area when they were approached by two male suspects. One of the suspects took out a handgun and pointed it at the victims demanding money. The suspects checked the victims' pockets, taking property, then fled on foot.

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any

identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
