

# Daily Report 10/10/16

## Community Events

October 11 – Neighborhood Safety Meeting at 6:30pm at 199 Taylor Av

**In the last 72 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 337 calls for service and arrested 13 people.**

**Good News** – Two handguns have been recovered in the Clay St area in the last week. On 10/06 at 7:30pm an officer was in the area of Pleasant St when he saw two people get out of a vehicle and walk away. The officer checked the vehicle and saw a handgun on the floorboard. One of the people who'd walked away from the vehicle returned and he was identified as the registered owner of the vehicle. Justin Bates, 18, of Glen Burnie was arrested and charged with possessing a handgun under the age of 21 and transporting a handgun in a vehicle. Bates was released by the District Court Commissioner on his own recognizance. The handgun was recovered and found to be loaded. On 10/07 at 9:15pm two officers were walking foot patrol in the 100 block of Obery Ct when they located a loaded handgun concealed underneath an outdoor a/c unit. The gun was reported stolen from a victim in Calvert County.

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201600004431 – Unit block of Colonial Av – 09/23 to 10/07 at 9:30am: Money was stolen from the vehicle after the convertible top was forced open.

**Theft from Vehicle** – 201600004437 – Unit block of Landings Ct – 10/06 at 9pm to 10/07 at 7am: A gift card was stolen from an unlocked vehicle. Another resident in the area reported their unlocked vehicle was also entered, but nothing was stolen.

**Armed Robbery** – 201600004455 – 600 block of Taylor Av – 10/08 at 10:30pm: Two men entered the business wearing masks and displaying handguns. They demanded money from the employees, took money, and fled the area.

## Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any

identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
