In the last 24 hours Annapolis Police officers responded to 112 calls for service and arrested 19 people.

Robbery and Stolen Vehicle – 201600004592 and 4604 – 1200 block of Ashton Ct – 10/17 at 1:30am: The adult male victim reported that he was seated inside his parked vehicle when two men approached him wearing black ski masks. The men pulled the victim from the vehicle, sprayed him with mace and punched and kicked him while going through his pockets. They took his vehicle keys and then fled on foot and could not be located. Later in the day, between 1pm and 5pm, the victim's white 2014 Ford Focus, MD reg. 6BX0641, was stolen.

Stolen Scooter – 201600004608 – 1900 block of West St – 10/17 from 7:20pm to 7:25pm: A red 2015 Baodiao scooter, MD reg. AT64887, was stolen from a parking lot when it was left unattended with the engine running and the keys attached.

National Takeback Initiative

The National Takeback Initiative will be held in the lobby of the Annapolis Police Department on Saturday, October 22nd from 10am to 2pm. It is completely anonymous, no identification is requested of people disposing of prescription medications, and people are therefore encouraged to remove identifying labels from containers. Liquid medications should be in a sealed container to prevent leakage (original bottle). Other medications (pills, tablets, etc.) can be in a ziplock bag or will be disposed of directly into the disposal box, and their original containers can be put in a recycling bin. We are NOT accepting needles or injectibles. Any other type of medication is accepted (controlled, non-controlled, or over the counter).

Submitting Anonymous Tips to Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland

Metro Crime Stoppers of Maryland is an organization separate from the Annapolis Police Department. When you text, phone in, or submit your Annapolis crime tip online Metro Crime Stoppers receives your tip anonymously and only forwards your tip information to the Annapolis Police Department. No identifying information is ever forwarded to us. Please be assured that only your tip is communicated from Metro Crime Stoppers to the police department, not any identifying information about you. Metro Crime Stoppers uses a special coding system to

protect your identity, they do not use Caller ID or record telephone conversations. If your tip leads to the arrest or indictment of a person for a felony you could qualify for up to a \$2,000 cash reward from Metro Crime Stoppers.
